Here are some of the things we will be learning about this term:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Your child will begin to learn how to:

- form good relationships with adults and peers
- be interested, excited and motivated to learn
- select and use activities and resources independently
- work as part of a group or class, taking turns and sharing fairly
- respond to significant experiences, showing a range of feelings when appropriate

Communication, Language and Literacy

Your child will begin to learn how to:

- attempt to write our own name
- form lowercase letters
- retell and sequence stories
- hear and say letter sounds
- read a few 'High Frequency Words'
- adopt a role during play
- attempt to write for different purposes

Problem Solving, Reasoning and Numeracy

Your child will begin to learn how to:

- Count everyday objects
- Recognise numbers to 10 and beyond

- begin add and subtract practically and in familiar contexts (e.g. rhymes)
- compare lengths, masses and capacities using direct comparison
- Sort and match objects

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

Your child will begin to learn how to:

- investigate objects and materials by using all of their sense appropriately
- know about their own cultures and beliefs and those of other people
- build and construct with a wide range of objects, selecting appropriate resources and adapting their work as necessary
- use simple programs on the PC

Physical Development

Your child will begin to learn how to:

- move with confidence, imagination and in safety
- develop awareness of space
- demonstrate fine motor control and co-ordination
- use a range of small equipment e.g. balls, bean bags, quoits

Creative Development

Your child will begin to learn how to:

- explore colour, texture, shape, form and space in two and three dimensions
- respond in a variety of ways to what they see, hear, smell, touch and feel
- express and communicate ideas, thoughts and feelings through artwork, role-play,

movement, designing and making.

How you can help your child

- Read to/with your child daily
- Learn the letter sounds (not letter names) given as homework and find them in books, on signs etc
- Practice High Frequency Words
- Practice counting objects
- Practice writing numbers to 10 and beyond when confident
- Visit the library and look for books about our topics
