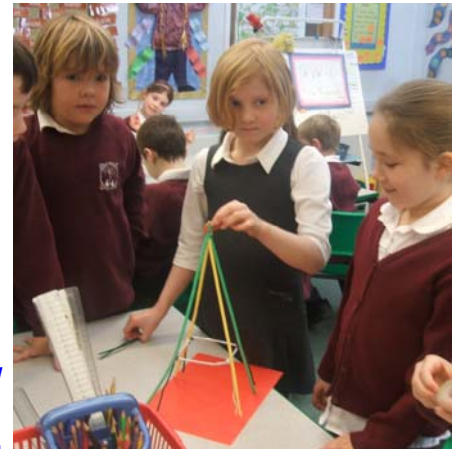
French Day
